FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE REPRESENTATIONS

The FTC’s Franchise Rule permits a franchisor to provide information about the actual or potential financial performance of its franchised and/or franchisor-owned outlets, if there is a reasonable basis for the information, and if the information is included in the disclosure document. Financial performance information that differs from that included in Item 19 may be given only if: (1) a franchisor provides the actual records of an existing outlet you are considering buying; or (2) a franchisor supplements the information provided in this Item 19, for example, by providing information about possible performance at a particular location or under particular circumstances.

The sales figures listed below include average and median Gross Sales derived from historical operating results of the franchised businesses indicated for the time periods covered. We obtained these sales figures from information provided to us by our franchisees for the period from January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025 (the “ Reporting Period”). Franchisees are not required to use generally accepted accounting principles when reporting these figures.

As of December 31, 2025, there were 328 franchised businesses in operation in the U.S. This Item 19 includes data from 284 franchised businesses, which were in operation and reporting sales for the full 12 months of the Reporting Period and they submitted their Gross Sales data using the Software System. The information provided in this Item 19 does not include data from (i) 20 franchised businesses that opened during the year 2025 and therefore were not in operation for the entire Reporting Period; (ii) 13 franchised

businesses that did not submit any Gross Sales reports to us during the Reporting Period, and (iii) 11 franchised businesses that reported \$0 in Gross Sales for the Reporting Period.

Seventeen franchised businesses closed during the 2025 fiscal year, and so they did not report data for the entire Reporting Period and therefore their data is also excluded from Item 19. Of the 17 businesses that closed during the fiscal year 2025, zero franchised businesses closed after being open for less than 12 months.

“Gross Sales” means the total revenues and receipts from whatever source (whether in the form of cash, credit, agreement to pay, barter, trade, or other consideration) that arise, directly or indirectly, from the operation of — or in connection with — a Rainbow Restoration® business whether under any of the Marks or otherwise. Gross Sales exclude sales taxes collected from customers and paid to the appropriate taxing authority and any other bona fide refunds, rebates, or discounts that we authorize in writing. Gross Sales also exclude sales from any Excluded Services (as defined in a mutually executed Excluded Services Addendum (see Schedule I to the Franchise Agreement)).

All of the businesses included in the figures below are generally comparable to the Franchise offered by this disclosure document. Some of such businesses are “conversions,” meaning that they were operating businesses before they converted to a Rainbow Restoration® franchise, including companies that diversified their existing portfolio of businesses by adding our services to their existing operations. These businesses may have higher sales initially than businesses that were not in operation prior to becoming our franchisee.

Some outlets have earned this amount. Your individual results may differ. There is no assurance you will earn as much.
