Any State law regarding the offer and sale of franchises, franchise relationships and/or business opportunities will not apply unless the applicable jurisdictional requirements are met.

Temporary Closure or Operation by Us	5.3	In the event of a crisis, including potentially your failure to appear at the Host Location on any given day or habitual food safety concerns raised by the Host Location, we may, among other remedies, require a temporary closure of the Franchised Yummi Kiosk and/or take over interim operation of the Yummi Kiosk directly or through a designee for such period of time that the crisis (or failure to appear or food safety violations) are fully remedied to our sole satisfaction. During any such period of interim operation, we or our designee will be entitled to all profits arising from such period of interim operation.
