2025 Figures

The charts below represent an historic performance representation of our existing Pro Image® Sports franchisees in operation during the entire 2025 calendar year that operated similar franchises to those offered in this disclosure document.

These figures represent the period from January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025, and includes the 138 franchisees that were open and operating and reporting sales throughout the 2025 calendar year, are located in traditional enclosed mall locations under traditional leases with high occupancy rates or in urban shopping center locations. 18 of the franchise units represented below are partially owned by one of our principals. As of December 31, 2025, we had 154 franchisees in the United States. The additional franchise units that are not included in the table, include 9 that closed during 2025, 16 that opened after January 1, 2025, or one that is a small town concept/ not operating in a traditional mall or urban shopping center. No outlet was closed after being open for fewer than 12 months.

Affiliate Owned Units. Our CEO, Jake Riley, is a part owner with at least 43% ownership in multiple franchise units. The below figures represent the annual gross and net sales for 18 units for the period of January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025. 0 of the 18 units were open only for part of the year. The units are in various time zones and are in locations with different customer demographics. There are no material financial and operational differences between these units and operational franchise units.

Explanatory Notes

1. Gross sales also includes insurance proceeds and/or condemnation awards for loss of sales, profits, or business. "Gross sales" excludes bona fide credits or returns and excludes amounts paid by you for sales or use taxes on the sale of any products or services and excludes sales of gift cards or similar products (but the redemption of any such card or product will be included in gross sales).

2. “Average” means the sum of all data points in a set, divided by the number of data points in that set.
3. “Average gross sales” means the sum of the gross sales of the locations listed in an applicable group divided by the number of locations in that group.
4. “Median” means the data point that is in the center of all data points used. That number is found by examining the total number of data points and finding the middle number in that set. In the event the number of data points is an odd number, the median will be the center number. If the dataset contains an even number of data points, the median is reached by taking the 2 numbers in the middle, adding them together, and dividing by 2.
5. “Median gross sales” means the center gross sales number of all gross sales included in an applicable group.
