**ITEM 19**  
**FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE REPRESENTATIONS**

The FTC’s Franchise Rule permits a franchisor to provide information about the actual or potential financial performance of its franchised and/or franchisor-owned outlets, if there is a reasonable basis for the information, and if the information is included in the disclosure document. Financial performance information that differs from that included in Item 19 may be given only if: (1) a franchisor provides the actual records of an existing outlet you are considering buying; or (2) a franchisor supplements the information provided in this Item 19, for example, by providing information about possible performance at a particular location or under particular circumstances.

These financial performance representations provide actual, historical “AUVs,” or “Annual Unit Volumes,” for specific groups of franchised Sonic Restaurants. “Unit Volume” has the same meaning as Gross Sales, which we define in the note below. This Item 19 includes financial information for our 2025 fiscal year (which we will call simply “2025” in this Item 19), which is the period from December 30, 2024 until December 28, 2025. Indeed, federal and state franchise laws permit us to include in Item 19 either (a) a historical financial performance representation about the franchise system’s existing outlets or a subset of those outlets, or (b) a forecast of the prospective franchisee’s future financial performance. The information in this Item 19 reflects 2025 historical data for the AUVs of certain franchised Sonic Restaurants, and is not a forecast of future financial performance or a projection.

There were 3,120 franchised Sonic Restaurants operating in the United States at the end of 2025, 91 of which operate at Non-Drive-In Locations, including C-Stores. We excluded from these financial performance representations: (a) all 29 of the franchised Sonic Restaurants that first opened for business during 2025 and did not operate for the full year; (b) all 23 of the franchised Sonic Restaurants that were closed and reported no sales for extended periods during 2025, often for more than a month, either as part of remodeling or rebuilding the Sonic Restaurant, due to a hurricane or weather-related casualty or fire/water damage, or because of a relocation or planned transfer; (c) the one franchised Sonic Restaurant that operated at a Multi-Brand Location; (d) all 10 of the franchised Sonic Restaurants that operated at Non-Traditional Locations and had results that may not be typical for Traditional Drive-Ins (including 3 franchised Sonic Restaurants operating at Non-Traditional Locations first opened for business during 2025 and are therefore excluded under (a) above); and (e) all 3 of the Sonic Restaurants that we transferred to franchisees in December 2025 because those Sonic Restaurants were company-owned for a significant portion of the year. The financial performance representations in this Item 19 provide AUVs during 2025 for the remaining 3,057 franchised Traditional Restaurants (called the “2025 Franchised Restaurants”), or an identified portion of those 2025 Franchised Restaurants.

We also excluded from these financial performance representations (a) the 56 franchised Sonic Restaurants that closed in 2025, all of which were open for at least 12 months before they closed, and (b) all company-owned Sonic Restaurants that we or our affiliates operated as of the end of 2025.

Most 2025 Franchised Restaurants, other than the C-Store Locations, are free-standing buildings and include a drive-thru lane and a patio, and sometimes also an enclosed patio or indoor seating. The 2025 Franchised Restaurants are located across the country and in a variety of urban, suburban and rural locations and in varied markets with wide-ranging levels of competition. The 2025 Franchised Restaurants without inside seating (other than those in C-Stores) typically range in size from 1,100 to 1,700 square feet, including stalls and drive-thru, although there are some atypical 2025 Franchised Restaurants whose size falls outside this range. The 2025 Franchised Restaurants with inside seating (other than those in C-Stores) typically range in size from 2,000 to 4,000 square feet. The size of 2025 Franchised Restaurants that are C-Store locations varies with the type of location and ranges from 1,000 to 3,000 square feet. 2,093 of the 2025 Franchised Restaurants operate with drive-thru windows and the remaining 1,027 do not. The 2025 Franchised Restaurants have operated for an average of 28 years.

The first financial performance representation reflects the AUVs for the 2025 Franchised Restaurants, both overall and as grouped into quartiles (categories of 25%) based on their AUVs.

#### Notes

- (1) “AUV” or “Annual Unit Volume” for the 2025 Franchised Restaurants is the same as annual Gross Sales, which means all revenues from all business conducted upon or from the 2025 Franchised Restaurant, whether evidenced by check, cash, credit, charge account, debit card, stored-value card, exchange, or otherwise, and includes the amounts received from the sale of goods, wares, and merchandise, including sales of food, beverages, and tangible property of every kind and nature, promotional or otherwise (excluding restaurant equipment), for services performed from or at the restaurant, whether the franchisee fills the orders from the restaurant or elsewhere, and for any implied or imputed Gross Sales from any business interruption insurance. Each charge or sale via credit, debit card, stored-value card, or other payment means shall constitute a sale for the full price in the month during which the charge or sale occurs, regardless of the time when the franchisee receives payment (in whole or in part) for the charge or sale. The phrase “Gross Sales” does not include (a) sales of merchandise for which the franchisee makes a cash refund, if previously included in Gross Sales; (b) the price of merchandise returned by customers for exchange, if the franchisee previously included the sales price of the merchandise returned by the customer in Gross Sales and includes the sales price of merchandise delivered to the customer in exchange in Gross Sales; (c) the amount of any sales tax imposed by any governmental authority directly on sales and collected from customers, if the franchisee adds the amount of the tax to the sales price or absorbs the amount of the sales tax in the sales price and actually pays the tax to the governmental authority; (d) amounts not received for menu items because of discounts or coupons, if properly documented; (e) amounts received from the sale of Sonic-approved stored-value cards; and (f) any proceeds received for the sale of the restaurant.

- (2) We calculate the average AUVs in this Item 19 by adding the AUVs for each Sonic Restaurant in the applicable group and dividing the sum by the number of Sonic Restaurants in the applicable group. We obtain the AUVs for franchised Sonic Restaurants from sales reports that franchisees submit to us and from data that we collected from franchisees' POS systems. We have not independently audited that information. Prospective franchisees and sellers of franchises should be advised that no certified public accountant has audited these figures or expressed his or her opinion concerning their contents or form. Upon your reasonable request, we will provide written substantiation for these financial performance representations. The 2025 Franchised Restaurants offer essentially the same products and services, face the same kinds of competitive challenges, and receive the same level of support from us that we expect new franchisees will experience.
- (4) A free-standing location is generally a stand-alone building on a pad or outlot. An urban storefront is generally a ground-level, street-facing commercial space in a densely populated area. A Gas/C-Store location is generally a Drive-Thru Only Location, convenience store, gas filling station or travel plaza.
- (5) These financial performance representations do not reflect the costs of sales, operating expenses or other costs or expenses that must be deducted from the AUV figures to obtain your net income or profit. You should conduct an independent investigation of the costs and expenses you will incur in operating your Restaurant. Franchisees or former franchisees, listed in this disclosure document, may be one source of this information.
